

## Camp Eligibility

Boys and Girls grades 1-12

## Fees and Registration

**COST: \$150.00 per camper until May 19**, Any registrations postmarked **after May 19<sup>th</sup>** will be charged **\$160** per camper.

*Non-SCBO affiliated groups are not supported by the cooperative program and will be charged an additional fee of \$75.00 per person.*

A **\$30.00 deposit** will hold a place for the camper. Balance due should be given to your church leader before leaving for camp. Registration will be held in the Gym. To facilitate on-site registrations, only leaders go through the line with check made out to SCBO for the balance due.

Registrations must be postmarked on or before **May 31, 2018**.

The church leader will complete a **Registration Form and Acknowledgement and Assurance Form** to be sent with the **\$30.00** per person deposit to:

If cancellation is necessary, money will be refunded **ONLY** if cancellation is made on or **before May 31, 2018**. After which date no refunds can be made.

## Additional Required Docs:

Seneca Lake Baptist Assembly requires a **MEDICAL FORM** to be completed and sent with **each camper**. No camper will be permitted to stay without a signed Medical Form. ## What do I need at camp?
